 - Independent study, honors thesis, Excel (contact Biology, Chemistry, Neuroscience, Psychology or other dept. faculty), LEARN, CURE
 - Teaching Assistant (contact Biology faculty)
 - RUI/REU (elsewhere)...search the web
- Check out Sigma Xi

- Review Health Professions Program website (http://healthprofessions.lafayette.edu/). Director for the Health Professions Program is Mrs. Glaus and the Faculty Health Profession Advisor is Prof. Nancy Waters (Biology)
- Contact Ms. Herschlag, Administrative Coordinator for HP, to sign up for the HP listserve emails and programming notices.
- Engage with HP Advising early and consistently to develop and support your aspirations
- GPA...study, work hard
- Manage multiple academic requirements: GPA, MCAT, DAT, OAT, GRE, research--as well as clinical, volunteering, shadowing and leadership activities to show your passion. Volunteer, shadow, internship, demonstrate leadership
- Research Experience
 - On-Campus (i.e. Independent Research, Honors Thesis, Excel, CURE)
 - Off-Campus (i.e. LEARN (research with Lafayette alums); RUI/REU (elsewhere, federally funded)...search the NSF website for opportunities)
- Consider the benefits of a growth year...or two...schools seek applicants with lived experience and maturity (and the average age of MS 1 is now 24+!)
- Demonstrate with evidence how you meet the Core Competencies developed by AAMC and now used in some form by every health professions school in the country. (https://www.aamc.org/services/admissions-lifecycle/competencies-entering-medical-students)

Courses not offered at Lafayette

- Human Anatomy and Physiology I and II
- Some HP programs will accept substitution of these:
- Biol 213 Comparative Vertebrate Anatomy and
- Biol 251 Human Physiology.
- Programs vary; do your research on each program's requirements! other requisite outliers: nutrition, public speaking, microbiology, and statistics specifications
- Consider LVAIC courses (e.g., Cedar Crest) or comparable summer offerings near home ONLY as a last resort means to complete core requirements or if unavailable at Lafayette. *require preapproval IN ADVANCE from our Registrar if they are to count for degree.
- NOTE: Many of you will have AP credit for Biology (111/112), Chemistry (107/108), Math (125 or 161), and English (110) courses. Use AP credit only sparingly; most schools will expect additional upper level coursework if you choose to use AP to meet intro level math, biology, english, etc.
- Covid Comment: In the pandemic schools may enact changes rapidly, or stop accepting courses they previously accepted. Rely on up-to-date, credible sources for your info...like HP Advising :-)




